What do you have to say for those considering running for a district or international position?

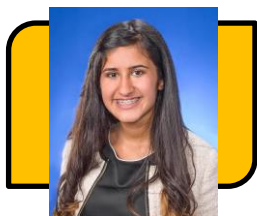

Other than these tips, please make sure to have fun!

What do you have to say for those considering running for a district or international position?

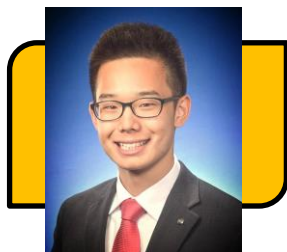
