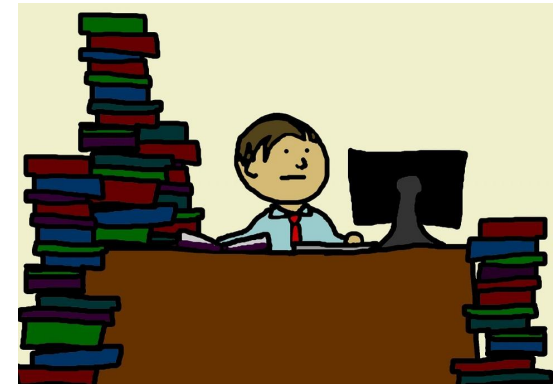


How to BEE A Successful Student



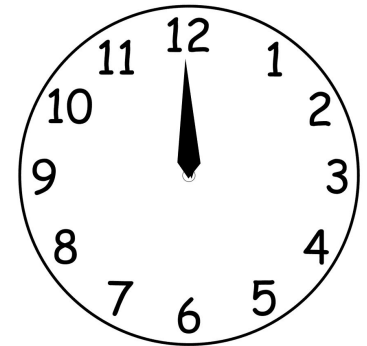
Prepare for tests

Always prepare well for tests, and do your homework! If you are struggling in class, ask a friend who is comfortable in the subject to tutor you. BEE Honest

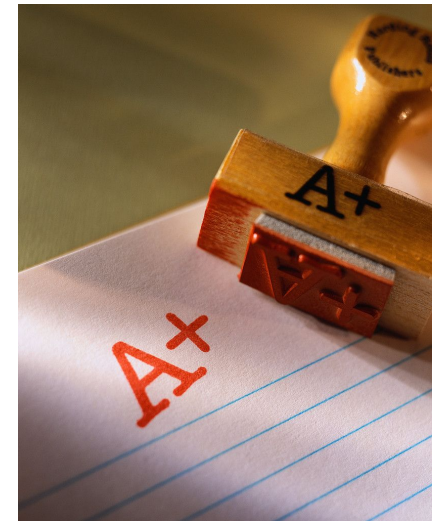

- listener
 - be attentive and ask questions!
- participator

- in taking notes
 - take lots of detailed notes. These notes can be extremely useful when reviewing information for tests and quizzes
