- Regardless of task (Spirit coordinator, service commissioner, etc.) the Vice President should always be persistent, set a good example and should be able to lead the club from the front or the back, supporting anyone who has lost their way in regards to Key Club.
- Understand the duties of each officer and member along with being open-minded about different ideas.

Weekly Duties

As a Club Vice President, these weekly duties ensure the success of one's own club.

- Keep a personal record of each club member.
- Assist the President in every way.
- Watch over the committee system and assist committee chairs.
- Attend all meetings of the project committee as a counselor and ex-officio member.




