The holiday season is a time to spend quality time with friends and families. This month, our focus is to provide basic needs to those who need our help so they can have a memorable holiday season as well. Whether that need is food, shelter, warmth, clothes, or a kind letter of appreciation, we will be making a positive difference to our communities! 1. Homeless Shelters/ Soup Kitchens

As the holidays come up there are many of those who are less fortunate and helping the homeless shelters and soup kitchens is a great way to help the community. Here are some ways you can help!

Soup Kitchens

Soup Kitchens are a great place to volunteer at because they help the homeless by providing them food, so call up local soup kitchens and ask about possible volunteer opportunities.



Canned Food Drive and Caroling for Cans

If you are not any local soup kitchens, or volunteer opportunity, you can start a canned food drive at your school and drop it off at an organization that will distribute the cans. You can even carol around the neighborhood for cans during Christmas, and collect cans neighbors may have sitting around!



Clothes Drive

Another drive that can help the homeless is a clothes drive. It is winter season, and it is getting colder so providing clothes to the homeless is important for their warmth.

3. Beads of Hope Africa



There are women in Africa who would break rocks for long laborious days and only earn \$1.50 a day. Instead they are creating bracelets out of recycled paper and trading to earn around \$250 a month for their families. Not only does this organization help these women earn a living to support their families, but they offer educational scholarships for children in Uganda. You and your club can help these women and children through Beads of Hope. This project can be completed as a fundraiser OR a service project.

If your club participates in the fundraiser, you can all earn 25% of all profits. But you must pay a deposit of \$250 on bracelets and sell all items within three weeks.

*Bonus: If your club sells 1200 or more bracelets, there will be an iPad 2 drawing for your club. For every bracelet sold by an individual member, that individual receives one raffle ticket. EX. Bobby sold 90 bracelets out of the 1200 bracelets sold by that club and so he will receive 90 raffle tickets to go into the drawing.

If your clubs does a service project, the club can earn one service hour for every one or so bracelet sold. Since this is a service project, the organization will loan your club all bracelets (no deposit required) and then the money made and any unsold bracelets can be sent back to them.

Gingerbread House Making

Combine holiday traditions with an opportunity for others to donate to a charity by building a gingerbread house!

Gift Wrapping Service
