INFORMATION FOR DELEGATES & MEMBERS

Delegate Registration

Every club attending District Convention must register delegates. There can be up to two delegates per club.

All delegates must check-in at the Delegate Registration Booth located in the **Exhibit Hall Pre-Function**. Delegates must be present at registration to receive their delegate wristband and printed booklet. The Delegate Registration Booth will be open during the following times:

> Friday, April 21st from 2:30 - 7:00 PM and 10:45 - 11:15 PM Saturday, April 22nd from 7:00 - 7:45 AM

Candidates Color Key

GOVERNOR: Yellow

TREASURER: Green

SECRETARY: Red

INTERNATIONAL ENDORSEMENT: Blue

To help you identify the office that each candidate is running for, the above **colors** have been assigned to **each position**. Be on the lookout for these specific colors during Candidate Meet & Greet and Caucus Session!

Candidate Meet & Greet

Friday, April 21st | 2:30 PM - 5:15 PM | Exhibit Hall B

As a delegate, it is **highly recommended** to attend the Candidate Meet & Greet. At the event, you will be able to personally talk to each of the candidates running for a District Executive position or for International Endorsement. Use this time to learn more about their platforms, ask questions, and get to know each of the candidates before casting your ballot during House of Delegates. Remember, **an educated delegate is an effective delegate**, so use this opportunity to your advantage!

ELECTION PROCESS: CAUCUS SESSION PROCEDURE

What is Caucus?

Caucus is a session in which each District and International candidate is given a set amount of time to give a brief **speech** that details their goals and qualifications. Each speech is followed by a round of **questions** from members that candidates answer.



Caucus & Moderators

Caucus will be held in **Exhibit Hall A** on **Saturday**, **April 22nd**. It is advised that you arrive early as the session will promptly begin at **8:00 AM**. The Policy, International Business, & Elections Chair will serve as the caucus moderator while the District Governor will serve as the assistant caucus moderator. The PIE Committee Mentor will serve as the adult moderator to help the PIE Chair keep order. These moderators will time the candidates and deem which questions are appropriate or not.

Candidates

All candidates running for District Office or International Endorsement will appear in the Caucus Session and the timer will begin when their appointed time is scheduled.



Etiquette

The candidates are **not** to be touched, asked to ingest any material, or asked to partake in any behavior that is in poor taste. No objects may be thrown or propelled by any means in the Caucus rooms. **Rude behavior will not be tolerated**.

Persons are not allowed to enter or leave the room while candidates are present.

Procedure

During House of Delegates, candidates will provide final statements and answer **questions** from each of the current Executives. The delegates will then submit a **final vote** by ballot for the candidate of their choice.

Etiquette

After the Governor convenes the House, delegate entry and exit will only be allowed during periods **between** candidate presentations. In addition, **no cell phone** or any other electronic device usage is permitted during House of Delegates.

Nominating Conference

If there are more than **two** candidates for a District office, International President endorsement, or International Vice President endorsement, or more than **four** seeking International Trustee endorsement, then a Nominating Conference will be conducted. The candidates will be introduced and voted on in the following order: Governor, Secretary, Treasurer, and International Endorsement. There will be no speeches or questions.

After the Nominating Conference, two final candidates per Executive position and up to four endorsement candidates will appear on the final ballot.

International Endorsement

International rules state that "a district shall endorse not more than **one** candidate for the office of President or Vice-President, and **two** candidates for the office of Trustee." If there is only one candidate for endorsement, delegates will choose whether to vote "yes" to endorse the candidates or vote "no" to not endorse the candidates.

Spectators

A **spectator section** for non-delegate members and adult chaperones will be provided. Spectators may **not** sit with or talk to the delegates, nor take part in the process. **Silence** must be observed at all times. Entry and exit of spectators will only be allowed during periods between candidate presentations.

Election Results

The results of the ballot voting will be announced **Saturday evening** during the third General Session.



During caucus, any time remaining after a candidate finishes their speech is open for questions. Adults are not allowed to ask questions or suggest questions to the members.

ACCEPTABLE QUESTIONS

relate to a candidate's qualifications, platform, past experience, plans, and goals.

EXAMPLES OF GOOD QUESTIONS:

- How will you balance this position with school, family, and other extracurricular activities?
- What is your strongest leadership skill and how will you apply this to serve your members?
- What have you learned from observing the current member in office and how will this affect your term, if elected?
- Out of all the core values, which one is your favorite and how will you apply it?
- What past experience have you had that helped you prepare to run for this position?
- How will you voice the membership's opinions and ideas?
- What is your weakest quality and how will you work to improve it through this position?
- How do you plan on holding yourself accountable for the various tasks you will have?

UNACCEPTABLE QUESTIONS

reference irrelevant or inappropriate topics or are related to sex, religion, race, or politics.

EXAMPLES OF BAD QUESTIONS:

- What is the address of the CNH Kiwanis District Office?
- Why are you better than [insert candidate name]?
- How do you feel?

FAQS

1. If my home club did not register delegates online prior to DCON, can I still register as a delegate?

Yes, members are still able to register at the designated Delegate Registration Booth on-site during District Convention, prior to the start of Caucus Session and House of Delegates.

2. Are there any pre-election functions that members should be attending?

Members are encouraged to attend Candidate Meet & Greet on Friday.

3. Before caucus begins, are rules/procedures/other information shared with the attendees?

The Policy, International, and Elections Committee hosts the election and releases guidelines for caucus questions in the Candidates Booklet.

4. Is there an introduction of candidates or list read off before the elections of the candidates?

Candidates each create one-page literatures that are included in this booklet. Candidates are announced as they enter the room. They are also introduced during the first general session on Friday.

5. When will the results be announced?

The election results are announced during General Session 3.

6. When do the elected officials begin their term?

Immediately following installation on Sunday morning.

GENERAL

- 1. Provide an example of a time you experienced a leadership struggle. How did you address this?
- 2. How has Key Club shaped your perspective on community service?
- 3. What is one area of improvement for the District and how will you address it?
- 4. How will you promote diversity, equity, and inclusiveness?
- 5. How will you handle criticism?

REMEMBER: Your goal is to make an informed decision regarding the election—not make inappropriate comments!

GOVERNOR

- 1. In what new ways will you use the District Committees to promote organizational growth?
- 2. How will you effectively represent the interests of the CNH District at the International level?
- 3. What new resources will you create to support club officers, specifically Presidents and Vice Presidents?

SECRETARY

- How will you keep yourself accountable for managing DMRF submissions and other reports in accordance with deadlines?
- 2. What would you consider to be the biggest challenge of a Club Secretary and how will you address this?
- 3. How will you enforce the integrity of a service hour within CNH?

TREASURER

- 1. How will you decrease reliance on division-level fundraisers and strengthen club-level fundraisers?
- 2. What new methods will you use to promote club reactivation and recovery from inactivity?
- 3. Attending District Convention can be very expensive. How will you guide clubs in raising funds to subsidize costs for members?

INTERNATIONAL

- 1. What is your strategy for addressing the needs of smaller versus larger districts?
- 2. How will you improve communication between the many levels of Key Club International?
- How will you cultivate an organization that embraces inclusivity of clubs located outside the United States?

Governor Annual Responsibilities:

- Preside at all District Board Training Conferences & Meetings. Aide in the planning of the meeting and prepare an agenda which should be sent out to the board 1-2 weeks before the meeting. Provide a Governor's Report at all board meetings.
- Preside at all Leadership Team meetings and conference calls.
- Complete monthly reports and evaluations for District and International.
- Contribute to the District Newsletter monthly.
- Publish (at least) 10 Board newsletters, 4-6 Club Presidents' newsletters, and 4-6 Club Vice Presidents' newsletters. Newsletter information should contain relevant information to aid them in their positions. Include topics from KCI Distinguished Governor Guidelines.
- Publish two Club Presidents and Club Vice Presidents training manuals, one in the summer and one in the spring.
- Maintain and update a CNH Presidents' and Vice Presidents' email reflector on a regular basis. Update the officers on important deadlines, District and International news, and advice.
- Communicate with the District Administrator at least once a week. The preferred method of communication will be determined by mutual agreement.
- Maintain regular contact with your fellow Executives and encourage them to send out reminders to Lieutenant Governors on a regular basis.
- Maintain regular contact with the District Secretary & Treasurer via Bee Team reflector and other preferable methods of communication.
- Maintain formal, monthly communication with the International Trustee, President, and Vice President, and the CNH Board.
- Attend monthly conference calls for the Bee Team, Leadership Team, and committees.
- Ride the Kiwanis Float in the Rose Float Parade.
- Promote International and District programs & initiatives.
- Provide support for all board members.
- Promote and abide by the District Code of Conduct. Lead by example.
- Promote and abide by policies and guidelines regarding technology use.
- Plan and attend Fall Rally Sessions.
- Address any disciplinary issues in a timely manner.
- Evaluate performance of all persons on the Board and be prepared to conduct intervention meetings and possibly remove "underperforming" officers while adhering to due process as defined within the District's Bylaws and Policy Manual.

Governor Annual Responsibilities (Continued):

- Perform at least 50 hours of service to the home, school, and community and be a member in good standing in their home club.
- Assign caucus moderators, assign speaking assignments, assist with planning schedule of events, writing scripts, and completion of convention details.
- Judge Distinguished Lieutenant Governor.
- Apply for Distinguished.
- Represent CNH Key Club at various Kiwanis Family events such as District conventions and training conferences.

As District Governor, I strive to be the same individual my past Lieutenant Governor was, who can help push the thousands of members within CNH to become the best leader they can.



The California–Nevada–Hawai'i District Board presents the following District Bylaw amendments to be voted on during House of Delegates at the 77th District Convention.

AMENDMENT #1

Edit - Change all "he/she" and "his/her" references to "they," "their," and "them."

Example:

Section 4. The duties of the officers shall be as follows:

- a. The Governor shall be the executive officer of the district and shall preside at California-Nevada-Hawaii District conventions and at all Board of Trustees meetings. He/She They shall be an ex-officio member of all standing and special committees. It shall be his/her their duty to attend any convention of Key Club International.
- b. The Secretary shall keep all records of the California-Nevada-Hawaii district convention and of the meetings of the Board of Trustees. He/she They shall submit to the proper officials and committees all communications received from Key Club International. He/She They shall cooperate with the Governor in forwarding all official reports required by Key Club International. He/She They shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to he/she them by the Governor or the Board of Trustees.

Justification: Using gender-neutral pronouns throughout the District Bylaws promotes more inclusive language.

AMENDMENT #2

Edit - Article X: VACANCIES IN OFFICE BETWEEN CONVENTIONS

Section 1. In the event between conventions of a vacancy in the office of Governor, the Board of Trustees shall elect a qualified member of the Board of Trustees to become Governor for the unexpired term.

Section 2. In the event between conventions of a vacancy in the office of Lieutenant Governor, the District Governor shall appoint a qualified member of a club of the same division to be appointed by the Board of Trustees to fill the office for the unexpired term.

Justification: Removing the requirement for appointed Lieutenant Governors to reside in the same division would formally allow the District Governor to appoint a Lieutenant Governor that is from a different division in order to fill vacancies in office. The California-Nevada-Hawaii District has used this practice for the past several years to support divisions who were unable to elect a Lieutenant Governor.

The California–Nevada–Hawai'i District Board presents the following International Bylaw amendment proposal to be approved during House of Delegates at the 77th District Convention. If approved by the District, the Bylaw amendment proposal will move on to be discussed at International Convention 2023.

Edit - Article V: ORGANIZING AND CHARTERING OF CLUBS

Section 1. A Key Club may be established in a high school or community-based organization that does not have a Key Club upon petitioning Key Club International.

Justification: The original wording prevents a second Key Club from being chartered at a school or community-based organization that already has an existing Key Club charter. Specific to the California-Nevada-Hawaii District, this would mean if a CNH KIWIN's club exists at a school or community-based organization, a CNH Key Club could not be built and chartered at that location, and vice versa. Thus, it limits the growth of both CNH KIWIN's and CNH Key Club. Removing this requirement would allow both a CNH KIWIN's club and a CNH Key Club to be chartered at the same school or community-based organization.
