The March of Dimes works to raise awareness of prematurity and to reduce the rate of premature births. Key Club has been service partners with the March of Dimes since 1978 and has continued to work together to innovate new awareness and fundraising activities.

IMPORTANCE

Preterm birth is one that occurs before the 37th week of pregnancy. 1 in every 8 babies born in the United States is born premature. Birth defects are the leading cause of death in the first year of life. Through research, community services, education, and advocacy, March of Dimes hopes to improve the overall health of babies.

The YES! The Thirst Project is a non-profit organization that was initiated in 2007 aiming to help the international water crisis through fundraising to build clean water wells all across the continent of Africa. It aims to educate students and mold leaders that want to give back to the community.

IMPORTANCE

The Thirst Project has helped over 13 countries, 367, 323 people, and raised over \$9.7 million dollars for villages that have water contaminated water that increases risk to HIV, malaria, and world violence.

IMPORTANCE

This organization is a Key Club International Preferred Charity that all Key Clubs and members have the reach to assist. Donations to the Children's Miracle Network contribute to the purchasing of necessary and appropriate medical equipment and resources to save children's lives.

United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) was created in 1946. They advocate, fundraise, and educate for the survival, protection and development of children. UNICEF is one of the most recognizable children's organization worldwide.

IMPORTANCE

UNICEF helps give children the childhood they deserve. About 1 billion children worldwide experience emotional, physical, or sexual violence annually. Approximately 73 million children work jobs that put their health, safety, moral development and lives at risk. An estimated 650 million girls and women today were married before their 18th birthday

Through service projects, the mission of the Pediatric Trauma Program (PTP) is to reduce the number of children in CNH who are killed or injured by trauma. The goal is to ensure all children live happy, healthy and safe lives. PTP is not a preferred charity but is heavily emphasized in our CNH district.

IMPORTANCE

Pediatric Trauma is the leading cause of death and injury among children ages 14 and under in the United States. Unintentional injury kills more kids every year than any other cause. 8,000 families lose a child because of a preventable injury annually in the U.S. 90% of unintentional injuries are preventable
