

## WHAT'S BUZZIN' CNH?!

There's only one full month (and a half month) left in the term! First of all, I would like to applaud all of the hard work and dedication you have put into serving your homes, schools, and communities this term!

Quick goals update: As of February 19th, we have reached 25,175 dues-paid members out of our goal of 32,000, which is about 78.7 percent! Also, 675 out of our 750 active clubs, or about 90 percent, are dues-paid! This is a huge accomplishment, and we remain the largest District of Key Club International! Still, let's make sure to keep doing our best to increase those numbers and get as close to our goals as we can



#### POSITION INSIGHTS

For those of you who don't know, each club tracks data such as club meetings and service hours in their **own Monthly Report Form** (MRF), or MRF. They submit to their division and Lieutenant Governor, who, with help of their DLT, compile that information into the Division Monthly Report Form (DMRF). I **then go through all 82 division's MRFs, and give them feedback** on if they are tracking information correctly and which clubs could improve in various categories.

Aside from the MRF, as one of the three executives I help plan all large scale district events, such as Fall Rally and DCON!


#### POSITION INSIGHTS
