Quick goals update: As of February 19th, we have reached 25,175 dues-paid members out of our goal of 32,000, which is about **78.7 percent!** Also, 675 out of our 750 active clubs, or about 90 percent, are dues-paid! This is a huge accomplishment, and we remain the **largest District of Key Club International!** Still, let's make sure to keep doing our **best** to increase those numbers and get as close to our goals as we can

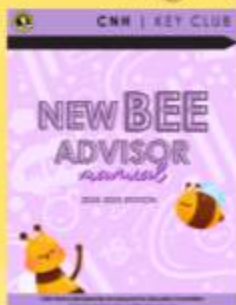

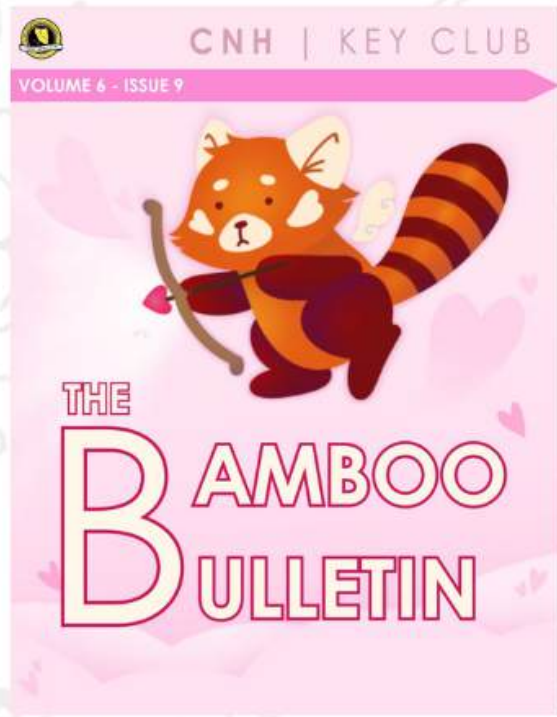
