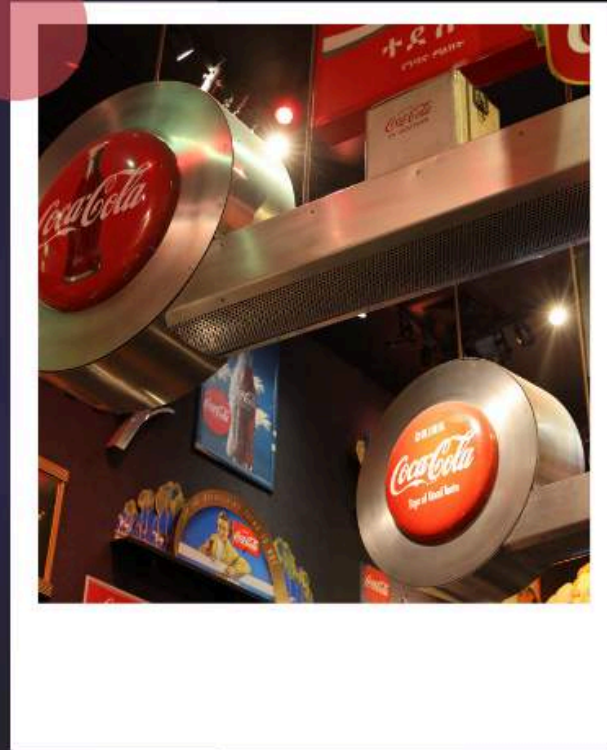

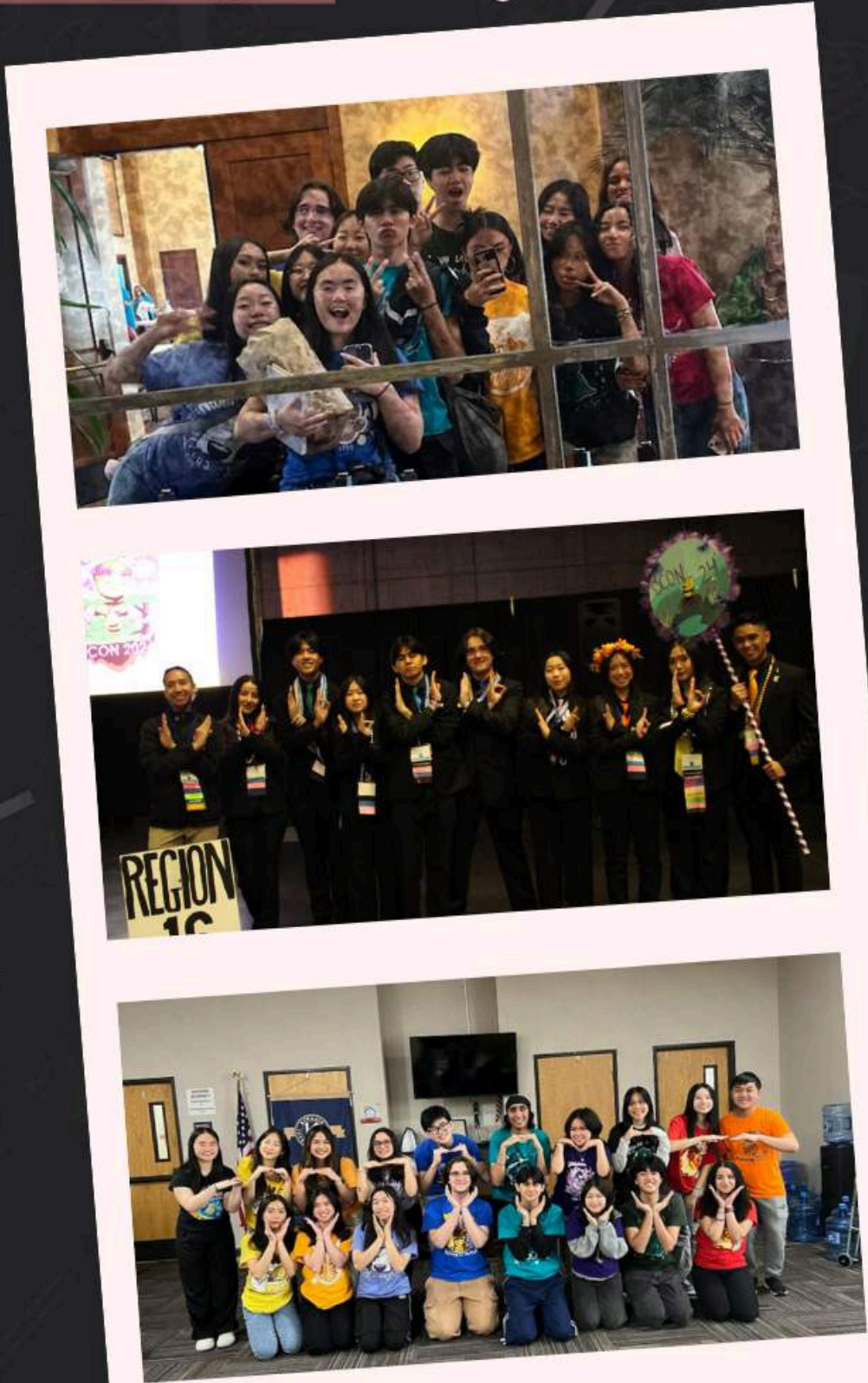

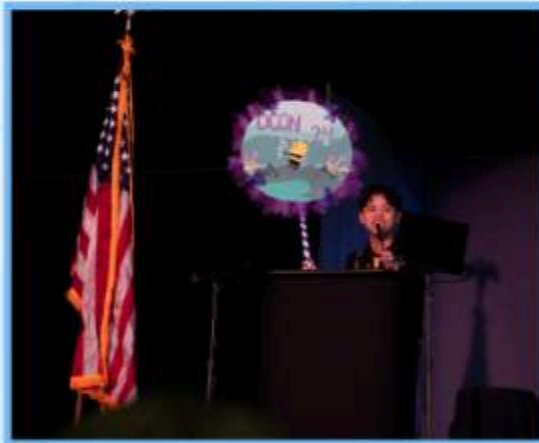


# DCON

## Step 1. Propose

- Communicate with home Key Club and sponsoring Kiwanis club
- Create a timeline with a Kiwanis Advisor for chartering



## Step 3. Recruit

- Advertise the club through school announcements
- Find an elementary/middle school liaison to reach out to students and create a roster

## Step 2.

## Communicate

- Gather support from school staff such as the principal by educating them on the Kiwanis Family
- Find and train a Faculty Advisor
- Actively communicate with everyone involved

## Step 4. Organize

- Conduct elections and create a roster for new officers
- Create club bylaws
- Assign a liaison from sponsoring Key Club for visitations, provide support

- Figure out who will sign necessary paperwork
- Pay all proper fees

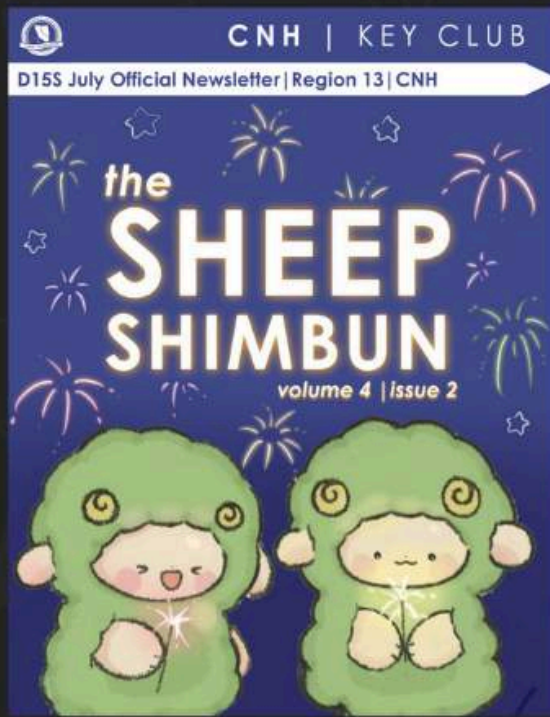

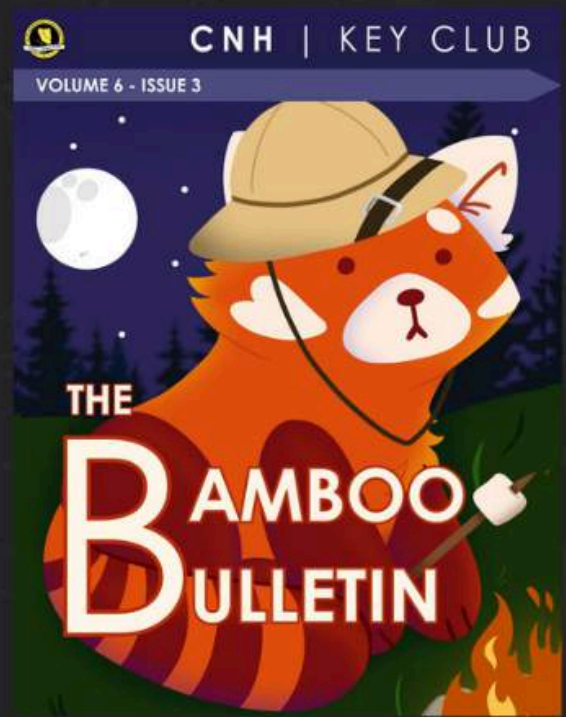

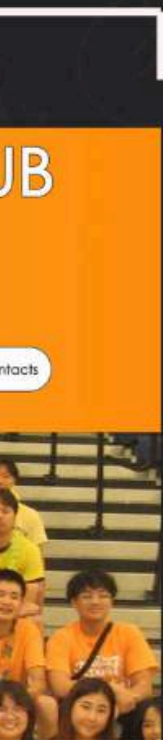
