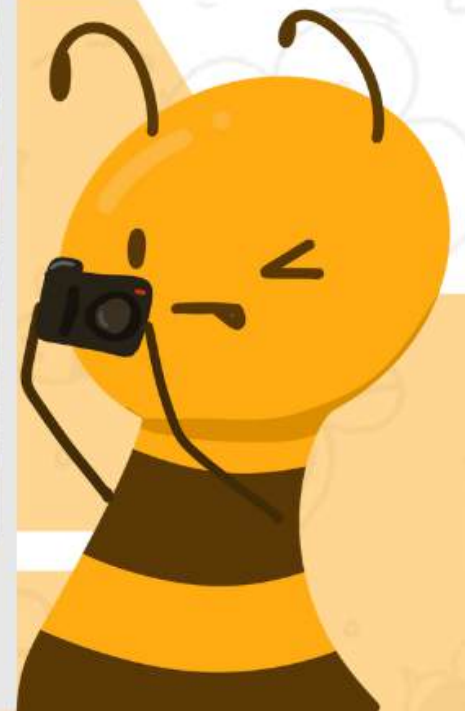

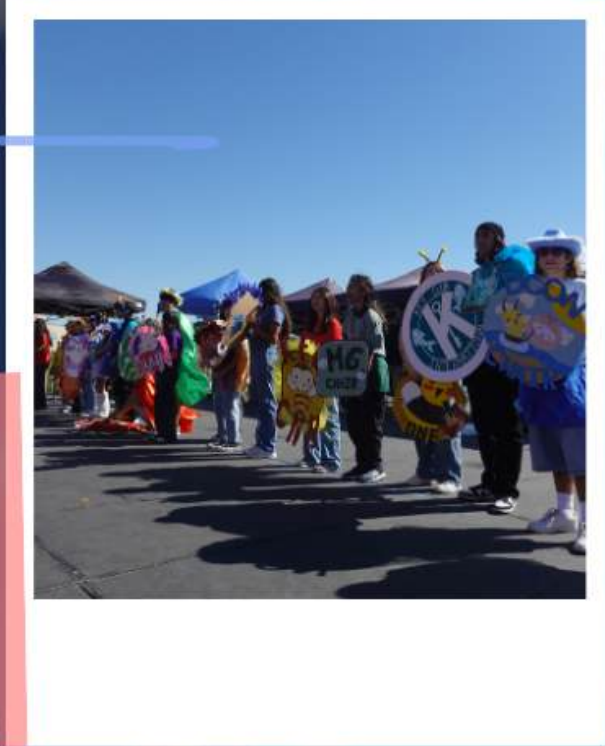

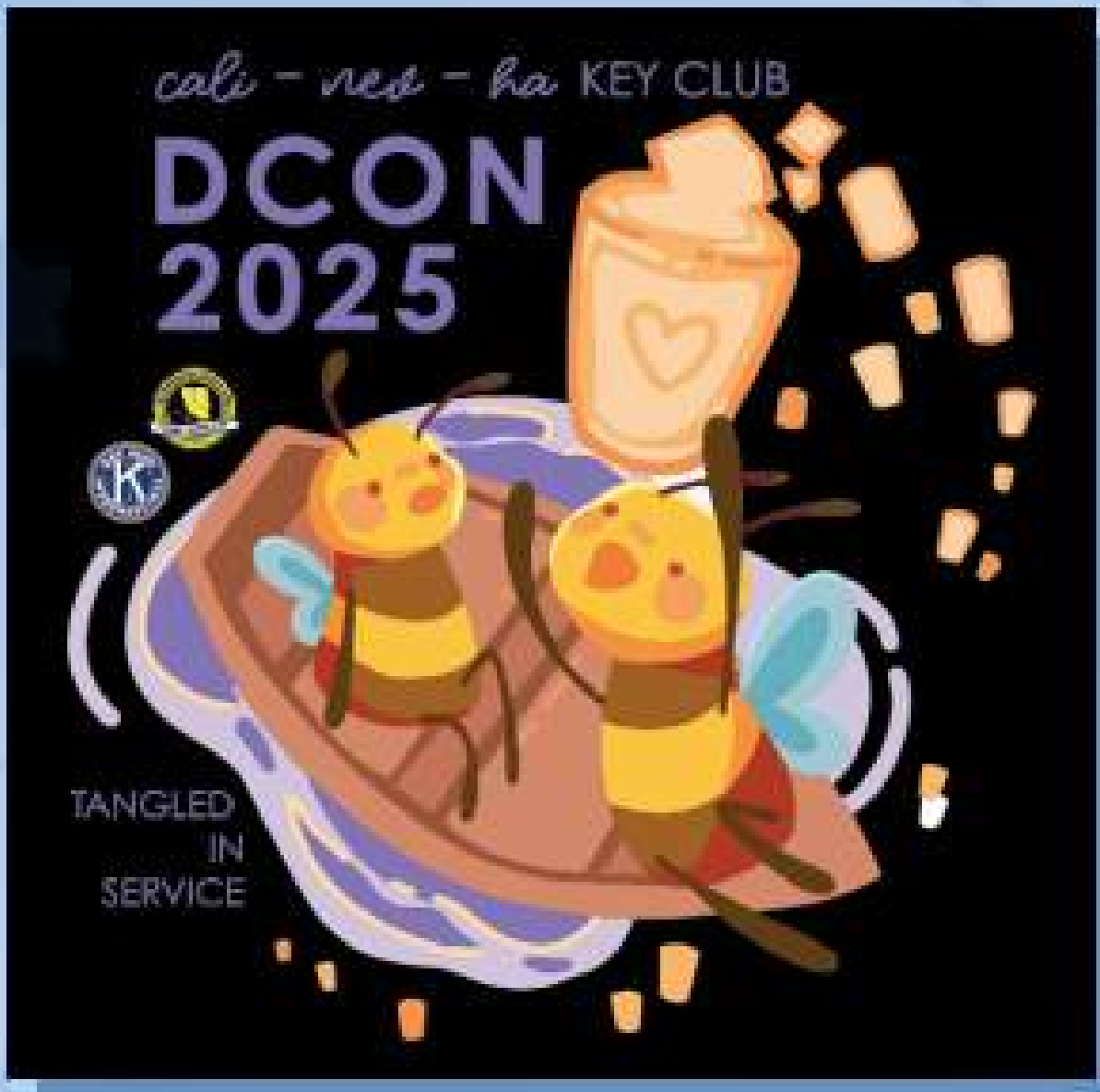

ner, start with a **free program!** These will help you learn the **basics** and to invest in expensive software right away!

**fundamentals** by watching **tutorials**. Focus on key concepts like **color theory**, and blending modes to develop a strong foundation.

**Custom shortcuts** for your tools (or customizing them) can speed up your workflow. Experiment with shortcuts like undo (Ctrl+Z), brush sizes, and selecting layers.

Don't get caught up in fancy brushes. Default **brushes** are more than enough to create professional-looking art. Once you've mastered those, you can experiment with custom brushes.

Create separate layers for your sketch, line art, colors, and shading. This way, you can edit each element without messing up other parts of your artwork.

Use **reference images** as guides to inspire your **own unique style!**

Remember, no one creates *perfect* work right from the start. Art is a journey of growth, so don't be afraid to **practice**. You'll improve over time!



How do I create engaging graphics?

- Develop a **theme**, and create a consistent **color scheme** (feel free to explore the internet)
- Use cohesive Key Club fonts like **Century Gothic** and **Hello Stranger** to maintain a unified look
- **Less is more!** Don't overload your graphic with too many colors/fonts
- BEE **Safe-KEY** and follow Key Club **Graphic Standards** (can be found on Cyberkey)

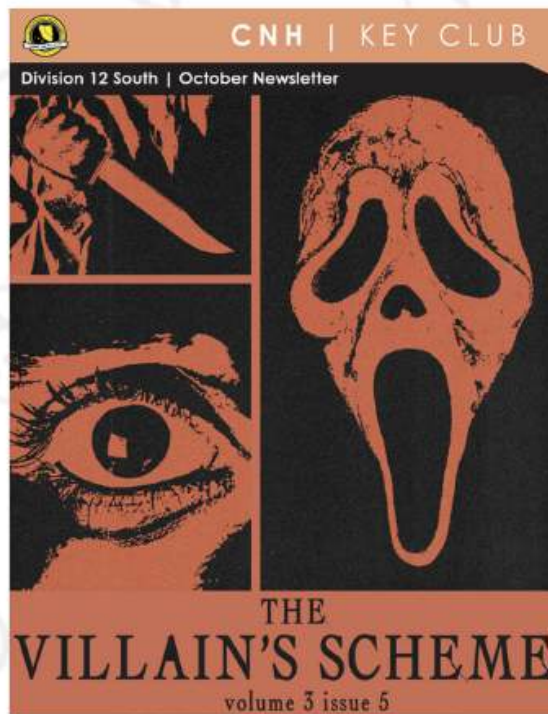
